- Three faculty members are Ph. D. guides having six research students working under their guidance.

- The College Library fully functional with SOUL software and subscriber of N-LIST facility through which e-journals and e-books are made available to the faculty members.
- The students have also internet access in the library for browsing and reading of available online books.
- Library operational with Bar coding and OPAC.
- All science laboratories equipped with sophisticated equipments.
- Most of the classrooms are upgraded with multimedia projectors.
- All the departments are provided with computers, laptops, printer and scanner

- All faculty members are assigned various committees as per their interest to carry out all round activities throughout the year.

- The staff recruitment is done according to rules and regulation of the state government of Gujarat.
- The management recruits ad hoc faculty and staff as per requirement.

- Industrial Interface Cell (ICC) organizes industrial visits and guest lecture for the students.
- The students interact with industry people through UDISHA activities.

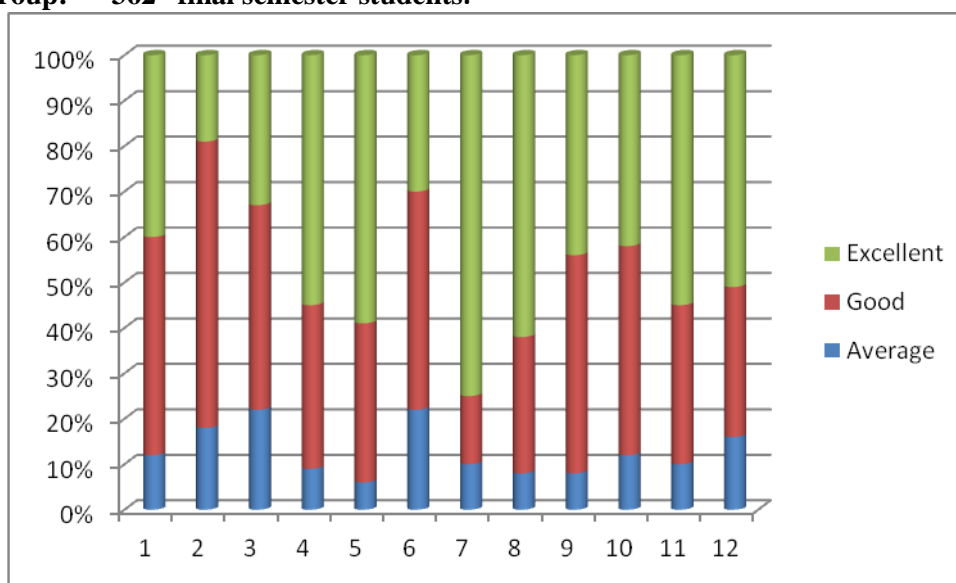
