Curriculum Development is done by University only. There is no direct role of our college in this process. Two of our senior associate professors are member of board of studies of Gujarat University. However any suggestions for the improvement in curriculum development are being sent to Gujarat University through these members.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Students were given Assignments questions and answers to be submitted by students assess for evaluation. Project work also assigned to the students as a part of curriculum. Routine evaluation during classroom teaching and also through seminars, internal examination test etc.

Academically weak students were identified during classroom teaching and advised for remedial classes. Extra remedial coaching classes are arranged for socially under privileged students for better performance in exams.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Internal Examination and Evaluation - Students were evaluated continuously through objective type test, descriptive test.

External Examination and Evaluation - Annual Exam is conducted by University.

Minor research projects are carried out by the faculty members.
